The Kingdom Of God

The Summer schedule begins in June. Children's Ministries and our Music Department hold three very important events that involve not only the children of the church but many adult and young adult volunteers. **Vacation Bible School** will be held the week of **June 13-17, Music Camp July 18-22, and Fun Arts Camp** the following week. I hope you get a chance to attend the closing programs of each of these special ministries to our children. I also hope you just happen upon the campus in the mornings ...it will encourage you about the future of this church. God is raising up young disciples and is using us in this great work. Please pray for **Cary Koepke, Kath Doerr and Jay Arnn**, and all of the volunteer leaders as they lead us this summer.

In the Church liturgical calendar, the season moves to what Presbyterians call Ordinary Time. The liturgical color is green...the color of life. The season of Ordinary time follows the Ascension of Christ to the right hand of God...the enthronement of Jesus as King of Kings and Lord of Lords...He then pours out the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Jesus is pictured as reaping a harvest, a kind of first fruit of the ultimate harvest on the Last Day.

On Pentecost, through the Apostles' preaching, a harvest of 3000 souls are added to the Church, a reversing of the sad story of the Golden Calf on that first Pentecost at Mount Sinai and the loss of 3000 (*Ex 32*). It represents the ordination of all of the believers in the Messiah; as priests and the reversal of the truncated priesthood limited to the tribe of Levi as a sad consequence of Israel's unfaithfulness with the Golden Calf. Now, every believer is ordained to be a priest of God, an intercessor, a conveyor of His presence and glory and word to the earth. Pentecost Sunday is June 12th. Ordinary time is, as Luke implies in the opening verses of the book of Acts, all that Jesus continues to do on the earth after He ascended into Heaven to rule...until God has put every

enemy under His feet...at which time, history will come to an end and the Son will turn the Kingdom over to the Father in what theologians have come to call the Eternal State (*1 Cor 15:20-25*). Ordinary Time is what others have called A.D.



anno domini...in the year of our Lord's reign...meaning in the year of King Jesus' reign. Jesus' reign is marked by a continuing amnesty to all who repent. If an enemy of Christ will hear the Good News and repent of their rebellion, the King will receive them, forgive them, adopt them, ordain them and empower them for ministry. This amnesty continues until Judgment Day when the sheep and the goats will be separated as described in *Matthew 25*. During this period those who die in Christ pass immediately from this life into the presence of God as their souls and bodies are separated until the great day of the Lord when their bodies will be raised unto eternal life (*2 Cor 5:6-10*). The New Testament has much to say by way of assurance of the hope of Heaven being only part of the hope offered to believers. Our enduring hope is the hope of the resurrection of the body unto eternal life (*1 Cor 15:51-58*). So reflect on the hope Jesus has left for us...in this Time, which is not so *Ordinary* after all.

There will surely be developments for the PCUSA this summer. Please pray for the state of the church local, national, and international. The decisions made about *Ordination Standards, Form of Government and Confessional Standards* will have far reaching effects. Your church leaders are seeking God's wisdom as we move ahead... however, the ministry of our church, *To Be and Make Disciples*, continues and to this we remain as committed as ever.

It's Not All About The Fish

You've heard it said, "He is a jack of all trades, master of none." That is NOT **Ron Doerr**. Ron is a man of all trades, master of ALL. As I spent time with Ron, I was amazed to learn of all the things he has done and still does, and how it all ties in with his love of his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

That was not always the case. At the age of 18, Ron met his wife to be, Kath. Prior to meeting Kath, Ron did not know Jesus, but came to know Him and accept Jesus into his life through Kath. Ron and Kath have dedicated their lives to working with youth and sharing the love of Christ with them in Pennsylvania and Florida.

Ron is one of those people who are ever engaged in something. There is no time for things such as TV or, I wonder, if he even sleeps. He made me tired thinking of all he does in the course of a day. Ron began working at age 11 with his stepfather in his orthodontic lab. By the time Ron was 20, he was working in the Children's Hospital in Pennsylvania making appliances to use in their Teaching School. He also owned his own lab: R.E.D. Orthodontic Labs. At age 27, Ron sold this business to his staff.

Ron and Kath married on November 12, 1977. They became volunteers, then full time youth pastors in their Presbyterian church in PA. They have continued their work for Christ in many ways. Along with the Chambers Memorial Presbyterian Church, Ron was involved in a Street Ministry Program for intercity youth for 5 years. He loves mentoring young people. He is currently mentoring kids that he met at Christ Fellowship on Wednesday evenings. He is currently working on starting a Fishing Club. The Fishing Club will meet once a month and combine Bible study with fishing on Ron's boat. One of the young people he mentored said, "When ever I have a problem, whether it is at home, at school or with my friends, I feel that I can go to him. He is always positive and doesn't get mad very easily. That is exactly how I want to be when I grow up."

Kath is actively involved in the Children's and Music ministries at First Pres.

In 2000 Ron got his fishing license and became a part time fishing guide up north. Having been fly fishing in the Jupiter waters over the years, he knew this was where he wanted to live, so consequently in 2004, the Doerrs moved

College Mission Interns Sent by First Presbyterian

This summer First Presbyterian Church is sending college age missionaries to work for a month on the mission field. This is an amazing experience for college students to experience life in another culture, build relationships both with those who serve on the mission field as well as those who live in other cultures, and have an opportunity to serve and work alongside our mission partners. This summer we are sending five college students who applied to be a part of this opportunity to two locations. Each student is raising \$2500 to participate in the internships.

Three students from Palm Beach Atlantic University (**Stephanie Keul, Chelsea Furey, and Mollie Anderson**) will be traveling to **Athens, Greece**, to work with our mission partners, **Bob and Maria Hill**. Our church has supported Bob and Maria for a number of years and this has been a great experience in partnering with them for this internship. While in Athens, the students will live in a church in the downtown area and will be involved in a local church outreach. Their work will also include time at a children's camp, evangelism, and discipleship. They will also serve two nights a week with New Life ministry in reaching out to prostitutes. Of course they will see many biblical sites such as Corinth and Mars Hill. At the end of the internship, the girls will spend a few days in Rome.

Two students from University of Central Florida will be traveling with **South America Mission to Tres Arroyos, Argentina**. This city is a four hour drive south of Buenos Aires. **Stephanie Holland and Rebecca Hilliard** applied to participate with a new church plant in this city. They will be living with an Argentinean family and will work with the pastor of the church, Juan Medina. They will serve alongside other college age students from the church in doing outreach ministry, sports ministry, evangelism, etc. They will also work on a painting project for the church. At the end of their time in Argentina, the girls will travel to Peru and join up with the mission group from First Pres. that will be serving in Pucallpa, Peru, with our mission partner, Julio Chiang.

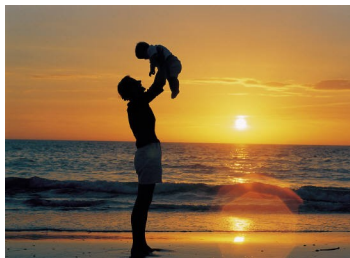

The Open Door Mentors For Teen Mothers

It gives me great pleasure to introduce First Presbyterian to The Open Door. Florida is fifth in the nation for teenage pregnancy. With this growing epidemic at hand, we now have a Christian program to do battle. The Open Door has partnered with our own church, which will offer support to teen mothers and their choice to parent. As Christians, I think we have to start

asking ourselves, are we pro-LIFE or pro-BIRTH? Statistics show that 46% of teen mothers, when they don't have goals or support, have repeat pregnancies before the age of twenty.

With the Open Door, each teen will be matched with her own Christian Mentor who will guide her in setting goals, parenting decisions and prayer. The program's mission is to demonstrate the love of Jesus Christ while enabling her to become independent and self-sufficient.

The program The Open Door is based upon a program called Teen Mother's Choices. It is Biblically based, balancing truth and grace with accountability. Over 450 girls have come through the nationwide Teen Mother's Choice program in the last 20 years and not one is relying on government services. These young mothers must sign a contract stating they will either stay in school or work full time, while delaying any further pregnancies. Each girl must attend her weekly Christian parenting classes and life skill classes, all led by Christians.

What will attract these girls to our program? The Open Door will pay for a teen mother's childcare, helping to keep her in school or in employment. The program will run on the same schedule as the public school system. They will attend their classes on Wednesday nights, joining us for dinner and fellowship. Prayerfully, this will be their gateway to attending church if they do not already have a relationship with their Heavenly Father.

We have partnered with First Care and Place of Hope in an attempt to share our resources. We are not sure when this program will be up and running, but when you see these beautiful girls and their beautiful children on our campus, please welcome them! God works everywhere, but we know His favorite place to work is His main office, the church. Unfortunately, they will not knock on our door, the church must knock on theirs!

City of Tranquil Light

A beautiful, searing book that leaves an indelible presence in the mind.

City of Tranquil Light is a beautiful story set in Revolutionary China. Enough historical background is given to explain some of the huge changes that occurred in the early 20th century to a country that had changed little for two thousand years. Bo Caldwell, the author, has based this book on the stories she grew up hearing from her maternal grandparents, who were missionaries in China. Will was a farm boy who felt he had no particular gifts or ambitions, but he wanted to follow God wherever He led. He met Katherine, a compassionate and determined young nurse, in China in 1906, and together they established a medical mission.

They provided care to great numbers of people with only meager supplies and equipment. Though facing disease, hunger, drought, bandits, and many other dangers, they are not portrayed as super-spiritual, but as humble, loving people who persevere in the midst of hardship and loss.

Once again, we see what God does through people who are humble and willing. Their love for each other and their love for the people of China create a memorable story.

The book is helpful for those who want to understand the tremendous growth of the church in China today. Many missionaries have quietly spent their lives planting seeds through the years that are producing a great harvest today.

Bill started the program by showing him acting as a "YouTube" type roving reporter asking the same question from kids in the parking lot to doctors at work.

What does the name Jack Welch mean to you?

Never heard of him! Who is he?

No one knew who Jack Welch was until he questioned a sweet young student who knew who he was, and when asked how, she replied "I just read his book".

It was great fun as Ron got the program going, waiving an unauthorized biography and asking questions. The book gave both of them plenty of ammunition and they got lots of laughs. Both Ron and Jack are pros at give-and-take and Ron did a great job. He must have stayed up late the night before.

Jack explained his grading system he used for all employees, just like schools and sports teams

keep score. He earned the title and nickname of Neutron Jack because he always had a scoring system for every employee and he fired the lowest 10%. He did this when he had 40,000 employees doing 40 billion dollars and continued all the way to 400,000 employees in the mid 1990's doing 160 billion with 240,000 employees.

The interview emphasized Jack's mantra of "Reward your best employees always" with bonuses, vacations and anything you can, to make the good ones heroes. Tell them that you appreciate their efforts that benefit the company.

Then Ron said "Let's talk about how you are devoting your life with your wife doing religious studies, and what your Christian life means to you."

Jack replied quickly "Now I am in trouble" which brought a big laugh from his fans!!!

He continued by saying that he has a very difficult time being a disciple to others, but Lucky and Ron tell him that by living life as a Christian, he'll be a disciple to more people than even they are because of all the people who know Jack Welch.

The S.O.B. programs are designed to bring new people into 1st Pres. When Ron asked "Who is here for the first time?," Hands went up with about 30% of the attendees or about 100 men.

Cost: \$60.00 per child. This fee includes music instruction, camp T-shirt, music, snack and lunch each day. (Scholarships and family discounts are available)

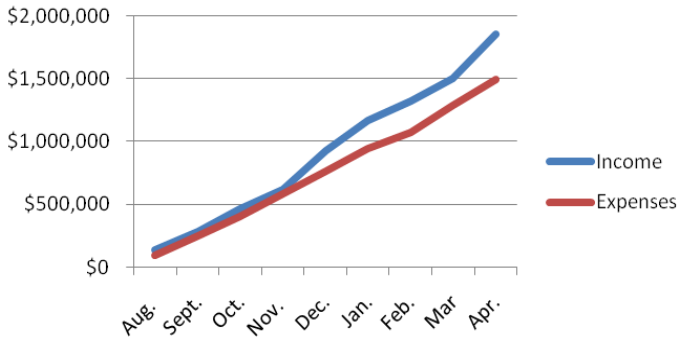
High School Volunteers: Musically inclined high school students are encouraged to volunteer. Volunteer credit hours are provided.
